Ms. Vaughn: Legislation No. 06-25-(05) and Legislation No. 06-25-(06) are Ordinances giving stronger teeth to the Housing Occupancy Code and the Residential Building and Property Maintenance Code which provide that the penalties will be a Misdemeanor of the First Degree instead of a Minor Misdemeanor which gives our Building Department an additional tool to insure that our housing stock is maintained.

Legislation No. 06-22-(07), Legislation No. 06-22-(08) and Legislation No. 06-22-(09) all pertain to "Small Wind Energy Systems" and "Solar Energy Systems." Legislation No. 06-22-(09) is the cost for permanent fees to install these systems. Legislation No. 06-22-(07) and Legislation No. 06-22-(08) are the legislation establishing the guidelines for installation of "Small Wind Energy Systems" and "Solar Energy Systems." In this age of ecology and energy conservation atmosphere we felt we would be one of the first Cities to put these in place and provide opportunities for our residents to take advantage of the new technologies.

My Committee has recommended approval of all of the above listed Ordinances.

Mr. Knuchel: I will make a motion to add this item to tonight agenda. I would like someone from the Administration to speak on this.

Mr. Gwydir: On December 1, 2009 we were notified that \$1.25 million was being made available for storm water improvements on municipal properties with a maximum of \$150,000 Grant to any particular institution. We looked over our area and decided that since there was no match we would apply for the grant to put some bioretention swells in and around the Service Department. This would stop some of the oil run off, collect some of the water running off by the recycle areas and in general make a nice demonstration project on behalf of the City. As Mr.

Knuchel noted the EPA was kind enough to grant us our requests. We were one of 19 out of 132 people that actually received the funds. I am open for questions.
