Winter is on the Way

Carbon Monoxide and Smoke Detector Maintenance



- New detectors are required after 7-10 years.
- Change your clock, Change your batteries.
- Minimum of one smoke detector on each floor or wing, placed in sleeping areas where they will wake you up.
- If you need help, contact the Fire Department at 440-951-2287, Option 4.

Before You Fire Up the Yule Log

- Have the chimney professionally cleaned.
- All wood must be dry, seasoned wood.
- Moist green wood will burn smoky and deposit a flammable coating of creosote throughout the stack.
- Maintain a minimum 3-foot safety zone for children, furniture, paper...
