She said she found the deer gasping for air and trying to breath in her yard but it was dying. She said she thinks that there has got to be a way to do what the city needs to do to control the deer population but also avoid the illegal and inhumane poaching of the deer. She said that she talked to the mayor and he confirmed it was a poached deer. She asked if there was a better solution than arrows that go completely through the body of the deer. She said that people who are hunting are not taking the time to follow through with their kill. She said she is pretty sure that there is other options for controlling the deer population.
